THE MARKS OF A COMMITTED DISCIPLE OF CHRIST

It has been said that the church today is sadly plagued with lukewarm pew warmers and there is often great indifference to the cause of Christ. There are significant differences between a backslided Christian and a faithful disciple of Christ. Consider the following below:

1. A backslided Christian will say that outwardly they believe in God. A faithful disciple of Christ takes God and His will and His Word seriously and obey His Commandments.
2. A backslided Christian may not go to church regularly and is prepared to work on Sunday as he or she takes the Sabbath lightly. A faithful disciple of Christ is committed to observe the Lord's Day and keeping it holy and wholly before the Lord in rest and worship.
3. A backslided Christian occasionally reads their Bible when he or she are in trouble. A faithful disciple of Christ studies, meditates, memorise and reads his or her Bible regularly.
4. A backslided Christian may try to pray when he or she needs something from God. A faithful disciple of Christ will seek God according to His will and often give thanks to God at all times.
5. A backslided Christian may use the Bible to justify his or her life or actions whether it is convenient whereas a faithful disciple of Christ seeks to make his or her life and actions consistent with the teachings of the Bible.
6. A backslided Christian will not be willing to sacrifice his or her time, resources or talents for Christ but only when it is convenient. A faithful disciple of Christ will be ready to carry the cross and deny self and sacrifice for the cause of Lord.
7. A backslided Christian may not give their tithes faithfully but give occasionally much less than the biblical tithe. A Christian will be committed to honour God and set aside their tithe regularly and joyfully to God.
8. A backslided Christian conforms his or her values and convictions to the world when under the pressure of culture. A faithful disciple of Christ will not compromise his spiritual conviction even in the midst of testings and temptation.
9. A backslided Christian will not bother to share their faith with others. A Christian will have a burden for souls and be willing and ready to share Christ and his or her faith as the Lord leads.
10. A backslided Christian may know about the Bible superficially. A Christian loves the Word of God and meditate on and practice it and exalt Christ as his or her Lord and Saviour.
11. A backslided Christian will not be committed to serve the Lord in the church with their gifts and talents but a faithful disciple is also a fervent and responsible steward of the Lord and accountable to God one day.

12 A backslided Christian will be likely late for the worship service (or even absent) for no good reason and normally do not sing to praise God during worship nor even read the scriptures nor pay attention to the sermon but the disciple will be attentive to the Word of God and participate fully in God-honouring reverential worship in the fear of God.

Which one will be a relevant description of you today? Something to pray and think about seriously before the Lord.

Let us strive to be a faithful disciple of Christ. The sad thing is that the problem with the average Christian is that he or she is just an average Christian. Let us pray for a revived heart of deeper devotion to God and His Word.
