TO OBEY OR NOT TO OBEY

As followers of the Lord Jesus Christ, do we have an option? When we do not obey we sin against God and we are guilty. The right attitude when we disobey is to plead for God's mercy that our God thru our Lord Jesus Christ will forgive us and cleanse us from all our unrighteousness.

What is Obedience? I noticed that Obedience to some is defined according to their own convenience. They select what they want to obey and what not to obey. I call this selective obedience. This is exactly what a church friend did. When he and his wife found out after the test was done that they will have a down-syndrome baby; they decided to abort the baby even though the baby is already after the second term or six months. Their reason "We cannot take care of a down-syndrome person". They decided to kill or murder for their own convenience. This is the extreme, but what about honoring the Sabbath day? Having tuition classes after Church service? What about attending Church Prayer meeting on Wednesdays?

Webster Dictionary defines Obedience as "Compliance with a command, prohibition or known law and rule of duty prescribed; the performance of what is required or enjoined by authority, or the abstaining from what is prohibited, in compliance with the command or prohibition. To constitute obedience the act or forbearance to act must be in submission to authority; the command must be known to the person, and his compliance must be in consequence of it, or it is not obedience – obedience is not synonymous with obsequiousness; the latter often implying meanness or servility, and obedience being merely a proper submission to authority."

As followers and believers of the Lord Jesus Christ we have our duty to God. We can summarize these duties into three areas. Firstly – LOVE GOD WITH ALL OUR BEING. We find this in what Jesus considered the greatest commandment of the Law in Matthew 22:34-38. Being the greatest command, then I would suggest this is our greatest duty. Secondly – OBEY GOD FROM THE HEART. Jesus said this in John 14:15 "If ye love me, keep my commandments." Jesus taught that keeping His commandments is evidence of true love. And thirdly – MAKE GOD OUR PRIORITY. Jesus said as part of His Sermon on the Mount in Matthew 6:33 that His will, His rule, His righteousness, should be our first priority. Not only over our personal concerns, but even over our duty to country as stated by Peter in Acts 5:29 "... we ought to obey God rather than men".

Where do you stand on these three duties? Many, claiming to be followers of the Lord Jesus Christ, labor under the idea that life is about working, getting married, getting a nice house, raising children, sending them to college, and having grandchildren. Of course part of this, is going to church and being a "good Christian." After this, they can happily die and go to heaven.

Everything in their lives is built around these values. When there are spiritual opportunities they say “no”; the result, God’s Eternal Purpose is not much of a consideration anymore. As Pastor Gan said “they are passive; just sitting on the fence doing nothing.” If you ask them, many of them even have no idea what is God’s Eternal purpose.

However, if we look at the first century followers of the Lord Jesus Christ, they were a different breed altogether. They lived in a very harsh society, where to be a Christian means torture, imprisonment and to others death, and yet their main occupation was the pursuit of Jesus Christ and the fulfillment of God’s Eternal Purpose. Everything else in their lives revolved around that pursuit. They were driven as it became their passion, vision, motivation and purpose.

What about you? Do you love God with all your being? Do you obey God from your heart? Do you make God your priority? Is the heartbeat of God; His Eternal Purpose a mere supplement to your lives? Is it taking a back seat to the values described above?

What is your passion, vision, motivation, and purpose that drives your lives and governs every decision you make? Is it the God of the Bible or your god of convenience?

We are reminded of the reformation started by Martin Luther in 1517, when he published his “95 theses”. The reformers went back to the Bible and stated “Sola Scriptura” – Scriptures only! This meant to allow the truth of Scripture to change conduct and practices that do not align with what the Bible says. They were willing to die for the truth in Scriptures rather than be forced to continue doing what they know was unscriptural.

Are you a Biblical believer? if you are, then you must heed the Spirit of God calling you and me to prioritize our lives in the light of God’s ultimate intention and magnificent obsession: to stand for and declare the truth to others.

SHORTER CATECHISM QUESTION 48
