SHORTER CATECHISM QUESTION 22

HONOURING YOUR PARENTS

Introduction

The Fifth Commandment says, “*Honour thy father and thy mother, that thy days may be long upon the land which the LORD thy God giveth thee*” (Ex. 20:12). Paul likewise wrote, “*Children, obey your parents in all things: for this is pleasing unto the Lord*” (Col. 3:20).

Obeying and respecting your parents may be more challenging for a teenage. Why? The lines of responsibility between parents and children cross during the teen years. When you were born, your parents did virtually everything for you. They fed you, clothed you, and changed your diapers. Now as you mature into young adult, you enter a time of transition. You increasingly make more decisions: how to spend your time, where to drive once you have your license, how to deal with a friend who wronged you, how to spend your money, and whether to apply for a job or not. You increasingly become the decision-maker and your parents step back to let you mature into adulthood.

Two challenges often present themselves during this time of transition:

1. Teens tend to overestimate their own abilities and want too much independency too quickly. Many teens are over-confident because they have not yet experience very much of life's realities and consequences yet. In other words, teens may want to play with temptation and sin because they do not see the dangerous consequences and think confidently, “I know how to take care of myself.”
2. Parents tend to resist and give too little independence too slowly to their teen-aged children. This resistance to “let go” arises from parents' deep love and concern for their children's safety and welfare, and their sense of accountability before God.

As a teen, how can you help your parents confidently give you more independence and freedom? By building trust. The more your parents trust you, the easier it will be for them to agree to your requests and to grant you more freedom to do things on your own.

How can you build trust with your parents?

- Be honest with them, even when you have done wrong.
- Ask for their permission to do things or when a change of plans occurs.
- Show your love for them.
- Communicate with them; readily share with them and be a good listener.
- Try to understand them, thinking about their God-given responsibility and their deep love for you and your welfare.
- Pray for them, even that God would help their weaknesses and faults.
- Trust your parents; willingly respect and obey them.
- Trust that the Lord Jesus can help you to do this; pray much to God for this

Conclusion

When doing this, by God's grace, you will be blessed as children, as teenagers, all the days of your life on earth, and even eternally! Trust that God's Word and promises are true.

Dear fellow worshippers and friends,

We are pleased to inform the worshippers and visitors of New Life Bible Presbyterian Church that **the church will resume holding worship services on Sunday, 2nd August.**

From 2nd August, the church activities will take place as follows:

Provided that there is no worsening of the pandemic in London, we hope to start holding the Afternoon Worship Service and Fortnightly Bible Study within the church premises in the coming months.

Changes introduced to the Worship Services held at the church premises

In compliance with the current Government guidelines, the following changes have been introduced:

- Worship services will be limited to 60 minutes duration.
- No singing and offering collection during the worship service. Offerings can be made at the offering box when entering or exiting the church.
- All Bibles and hymn books will be kept and unavailable for use.
- Adopt a 2-metre social distancing seating arrangement (household members may sit with each other).
- Face coverings to be worn in the church **at all times** out of consideration for all worshippers. For young children under the age of 11, the use of face covering is optional.
Please ensure you bring your own face covering.
- No food and drinks will be made available (Fellowship Lunch has been temporarily suspended).
- No access to non-essential areas of the church – this includes the Fellowship Hall and kitchen.
- New movement arrangements to be adopted (details to follow).
- Temperature measurements will be taken for every worshipper and visitor.
- Worshippers and visitors are required to complete the contact details slip for the NHS Test & Trace service. These details will be kept securely in church for 21 days and then destroyed. They will only be submitted to Test & Trace if a Covid-19 case occurs.
