WESTMINSTER SHORTER CATECHISM QUESTION 79

A: That even the smallest inclination or thought, contrary to any of God's commandments, never rise in our hearts; but that at all times we hate all sin with our whole heart, and delight in all righteousness.

The Measure of Your Faith: Trusting Christ in the Storm

Our Lord Jesus gave us a profound lesson on the measure of our faith when He calmed the stormy sea (Luke 8:22-25 and Mark 4:35-41). As the waves crashed over the boat, the terrified disciples woke Him with the desperate cry, "Master, Master, we perish!" Jesus arose, rebuked the wind and the raging water—and there was a great calm. Then, He turned to them and asked, "Where is your faith?" In that moment, their faith was completely overwhelmed by their circumstances.

The Storms of the Christian Life

The Christian life is rarely smooth sailing. We are all on a pilgrim journey, and on this earth, we will face unexpected storms: waves of disappointment, pain, illness, financial distress, broken relationships, or the loss of a loved one. These trials inevitably shake our belief. When the storm hits, what is our response? How do we carry on?

The answer is to anchor ourselves in faith in Jesus Christ—a greater, more mature measure of faith. The disciples did the right thing by calling on the Lord to save them. However, their eyes were fixed only on the storm, not on the presence of the Lord in the boat with them. Their cry, "we perish," reflected their fear and doubt that Jesus didn't care.

Are we not often just like them? We fixate on our overwhelming circumstances, allowing fear and unbelief to eclipse our faith. Jesus' gentle rebuke, "Where is your faith?" is a crucial reminder to us, His modern-day disciples, when we are gripped by fear and doubt.

Enrolled in the School of Faith

God not only saves us through faith but also enrolls us as students in the school of faith. It is His will that we grow in the measure and maturity of our belief. Every day is a learning experience—a time to learn more, unlearn wrong perspectives, and relearn the precious lessons of trusting Him.

God has provided the means for us to grow, and the only textbook in this school is His Word. "So then faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the Word of God" (Romans 10:17). God's purpose in testing our faith is to refine us and form Christlikeness within us. As James 1:2-3 tells us: "My brethren, count it all joy when ye fall into divers temptations; knowing this, that the trying of your faith worketh patience."

When our faith is truly anchored in God's Word, we can respond to the storms of life with a greater assurance, knowing that the Lord is our constant upholder. As the Psalmist wrote: "The steps of a good man are ordered by the Lord: and he delighteth in his way. Though he falls, he shall not be utterly cast down: for the Lord upholdeth him with his hand" (Psalm 37:23-24).

The Gift of Christ's Peace

In the Word of God, the Lord asked His disciples, "Why are ye so fearful? how is it that ye have no faith?" (Mark 4:39). Essentially, "How is it that you do not trust My presence and My promises?"

Even though the disciples failed the test of faith, Christ dealt with the object of their fear and rescued them. How often do we, too, fail Him miserably, only to experience our Saviour's unconditional love as He responds to our desperate cries for help? He loves you eternally and you are precious in His sight. We must never forget the sacrifice our Lord Jesus made to set us free.

Our part is to trust God completely and obey His Word. The result of this complete trust is an inward peace—a calm that only God can provide to quiet the anxieties and fears in our hearts. It is the same peace that settled over the sea when He rebuked the wind. This is the peace we have received from Jesus, our Good Shepherd: "Peace I leave with you, my peace I give unto you: not as the world giveth, give I unto you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid" (John 14:27).

Fortifying Our Faith

How do we build or fortify this essential faith?

- 1. Cleave to His Word: The only way to build up your faith is to constantly cling to His Holy, inerrant, and infallible Word. Faith comes and grows by hearing and applying it. As the Apostle Paul exhorted the elders of Ephesus: "And now, brethren, I commend you to God, and to the Word of His grace, which is able to build you up, and to give you an inheritance among all them which are sanctified" (Acts 20:32).
- 2. Edify One Another: We must also help ourselves and one another in fortifying our faith. The Lord has placed us together to edify each other in the most holy faith. In obedience to His Word, we work together to serve the Lord by praying for and encouraging one another, always putting God first. Let us continue to build on Christ and His Word. He is the Solid Rock on whom we stand; all other ground is sinking sand.

A spiritually healthy faith is necessary to ward off the temptations of sin from the flesh, the world, and the enemy. Just as a body is strengthened through proper nourishment and exercise, we must consistently build up our faith.
